SCOPE AND OBJECTIVES

Health risks associated with contaminated water and wastewater, continuous degradation of aquatic environment and water scarcity issues are contributing to the growth of the use of advanced technologies driven by legislative impetus. Emerging pollutants of concern include pharmaceuticals, endocrine-disrupting compounds, surfactants, plasticizers, disinfection by-products and other chemicals. The removal of these compounds will drive the selection of water and wastewater treatment processes in the very next future. This event will provide an overview of the current state of knowledge and latest advances regarding the use of Ozone and Related Oxidants for providing solutions for the control of emerging parameters including persistent organic pollutants, hazardous substances and microbiological contaminants in any water. How to get to Geneva? By plane, rail or road. The Geneva International Airport proposes a network of a hundred or so destinations spread right across the globe. A great advantage is the airport's proximity to the city centre: 5 km (3 miles). A direct rail connection links the airport to the downtown railway station in 6 minutes. The Swiss National Railroad system offers hourly links to Lausanne, Bern, Basel, Zurich. City and airport of Geneva are joined by rail with more than 200 trains a day. Many international routes have turned Geneva into a highway intersection for Europe.

Public transportation: All visitors staying at a hotel in Geneva can benefit from the free Geneva Transport Card. This pass is established upon the visitor's check-in in the hotel enabling its holder to use of the entire public transportation network without restriction (bus, train and boat).
